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Vocational Read Aloud: Late for Work

Trey works at a bakery downtown. He has to be at work at 5:00am to bake the bread. Trey has trouble waking up in the morning so he asks his mom Linda to set her alarm clock and wake him up at 4:30am. Linda woke up to her alarm ringing at 5:30am. She accidentally set it for the wrong time. She went into Trey's room to find him still asleep. Linda woke up Trey. He was more than an hour late for work and did not get the bread baked on time. Linda feels terrible that Trey was late for work but, she is also wondering why he did not set his own alarm clock. Trey is worried that he will get in trouble with his boss and is angry at his mom for not waking him up on time.

Paying For Your Items Quickly

**Read "Paying For Your Items Quickly". Use the passage to fill in the answers.*

If there is a line behind you, it is rude to make people wait!

Here are some ways to make your purchase go quickly and smoothly:

Before you get on line to make your purchase, know what bills are in your wallet! Estimate the cost of your purchase by rounding each price up to the next dollar.

While waiting for the cashier to ring up your items, have your wallet ready. Listen carefully for the cashier to tell you the total. Round the total up to the next dollar to help you figure out which bill to pay with.

When waiting for your change, get ready to have your hands free to take your change (bills and coins), receipt, and shopping bag.

If it takes you a long time to put your money away, then you must step aside. If there is a nearby place to put your shopping bag down at your feet while you put your money away, go there.

Make sure you don't pull all of the money in your wallet out for people to see. If you must do this to organize your wallet, do it in the car or when you get home.



When you receive your change and receipt you can:

1. put your money and receipt in your pocket or bag until you can find a place to organize it.
2. hold everything in your hands until you find a place to organize it.
3. put your bills, coins, and receipt together into 1 part of your wallet until you can move to a place to organize it later.
4. ask the cashier to put the receipt in your shopping bag or you can do it yourself.


