- c. Yell at her driver.




Bob is angry because he has a new job coach. Bob does not like his new job coach.

"Which Bill Do I Pay With" Chart.

This chart is used to teach students which bill to pay with, up to \$20. The chart anticipates the price/total is given with both dollars and coins.

Students place their finger on the dollar amount of the given price/total and then slide it along the row to the right to see which bill to pay with. Eventually, the chart should be faded out.

The smaller chart is wallet sized for students who struggle to generalize the concept. I laminate the smaller chart to resemble a business card. It slides right into a wallet and can easily be taken out for use.
